Matsuda's exceptional talent and musical sensibility instantly draws the audience members into his musical world. His unique background as a Japanese artist influences his creative philosophy, where he carves sounds that give form to "loud silence."



Matsuda is originally from Nagasaki, Japan, where he began his music career as a percussionist. The natural soundscape and landscape of Nagasaki—such as wind patterns on a mountain, waterfalls, and cricket sounds from fields—influenced his humanity, culture, and musical sensibility.



Matsuda has presented full-length recitals in Japan and the United States, featuring new works by living composers in collaborative projects, as well as some of the most challenging masterpieces for solo percussionists. His music style integrates theatrical elements, with a focus on body movement, music transitions, and the use of silence both within and between pieces.

He has also been invited as a guest soloist by multiple music organizations, including the Lancaster Symphony Orchestra, Palimpsest Ensemble, and La Jolla Symphony Orchestra.

Matsuda has collaborated and performed with renowned artists and groups such as Steven Schick, Roger Reynolds, Rand Steiger, Svet Stoyanov, Kunihiko Komori, Aiyun Huang, Palimpsest Ensemble, Lancaster Symphonic Orchestra, Red Fish Blue Fish, La Jolla Symphony Orchestra, and New World Symphony Orchestra.

Matsuda has joined the San Diego-based Taiko group, La Jolla Taiko, to explore and expand his musical abilities and possibilities. The influence of multicultural diversity shapes his musicality in both Western and traditional Asian music.



Matsuda's artistic career goes beyond music performance; he has collaborated with and led a group of artists as the artistic director for LAMP Production in San Diego and Casa Felice Music Group in Tokyo.

His groups have performed at over 100 venues, presenting creative works for children, elders, and live audiences. They have received generous funding from the Sony Foundation (2012) and the Qualcomm Institute (2024).
